## Thursday 23 ${ }^{\text {rd }}$ August 2018: GCSE Examination Results

The Willink School is pleased to announce the following GCSE examination results. The headlines are:

- 81 \% of students gained GCSE grades 4-9 in English \& Mathematics
- 65 \% of students gained GCSE grades 5-9 in English \& Mathematics
- $28 \%$ of GCSE grades were 7-9 or A*-A
- $34 \%$ of students gained the English Baccalaureate (an academic curriculum comprising grade 5+ in English, mathematics, sciences, a language and a humanity)

Head, Peter Fry, said:
"I wish to congratulate our students for a wonderful set of results this year. With the new 9 to 1 grading for most subjects, the demise of coursework and the tightened criteria in calculating the Ebacc, we were unsure quite how results would stack up. We can't make direct comparisons with previous years but the overall picture indicates we have at least matched our previous best. We were particularly pleased that 65\% achieved the new benchmark of grade 5-9 (and 81\% grades 4-9) in both English and Maths. The proportion of students achieving the highest grades were also the best ever. My thanks also go to our staff who have worked tirelessly in supporting our students gaining such great results".
