Nicolle Browning (Head, The Willink School) said:

We are delighted that most of our students have secured the grades that they required to pursue a wide range of courses and career pathways across the country. This includes 118 offers from Russell Group Universities. This year, we also celebrate our highest number of degree level apprenticeships with prominent organisations such as AWE, CGI, Oxford Quantum Circuits and Thames Water.
