As a Sixth Form student, we encourage you to complete **extra-curricular activities** that meet the needs of the competencies below. This will make you a more holistic, well-rounded pupil and make you more desirable to universities and apprenticeship providers when writing your personal statement or CV.

Seven Competencies

Universities and employers look for these 'star competencies':

- <u>Independence</u>- When have you had to work on your own to achieve something?
- <u>Leadership</u>- When have you motivated people to do something positive?
- <u>Teamwork</u>- When have you worked with others to get something done?
- **Resilience** Give an example of a time when you overcame a set back
- Analysis When have you displayed strong critical reasoning skills?
- <u>Literacy</u>- When have you shown particularly strong skills in reading and/or writing?
- <u>Numeracy</u>- Give an example of a time when you have successfully worked with numbers

You will get more experience with Unifrog throughout the tutor period programme; it is integral in Sixth Form. It is important that you keep your profile updated; it will be useful to you in Year 13 and start applying for jobs, apprenticeships or university.

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UCAS- University Process

If you are planning on studying at university after Sixth Form, you will most likely apply through UCAS, a central application form for all universities. All applications for UK universities are processed through UCAS.



Preparation

- 1. Choose relevant A Levels for the subject that you want to study:
 - a. Medicine Chemistry, Biology, Maths
 - b. Engineering Maths, Physics
 - c. Law History, English Literature
 - d. Psychology Psychology
 - e. Liberal Arts English Literature, Art, Drama
 - f. Not sure? choose a variety of subjects to keep your options open
- 2. During Y12 take the opportunities for extra-curricular experiences:
 - a. Work experience essential for some degrees e.g. anything medical
 - b. MOOCs short online courses that supplement what you learn in lessons
 - c. Enrichment activities (DofE or NCS) to widen your horizons
 - d. Moldova Trip
 - e. Go to university open days from May-July

Making an application

At the end of Year 12 we expect **every student** to begin an application to UCAS.

This does not commit you going to university but does save you a lot of time in Year 13 so that you can focus on writing a good personal statement. Incorporating details of your academic achievements and your extracurricular interests, which you will have stored on Unifrog, will allow you to express yourself as well as your love for the subject you wish to study. Mrs Lake, our UCAS co-ordinator, and your tutor will guide you through the process if you have any questions. Some universities offer places on a grades-based offer (grades ABB for example) but some will offer places on a points-based tariff. Please see below for the points equivalent for future planning:
